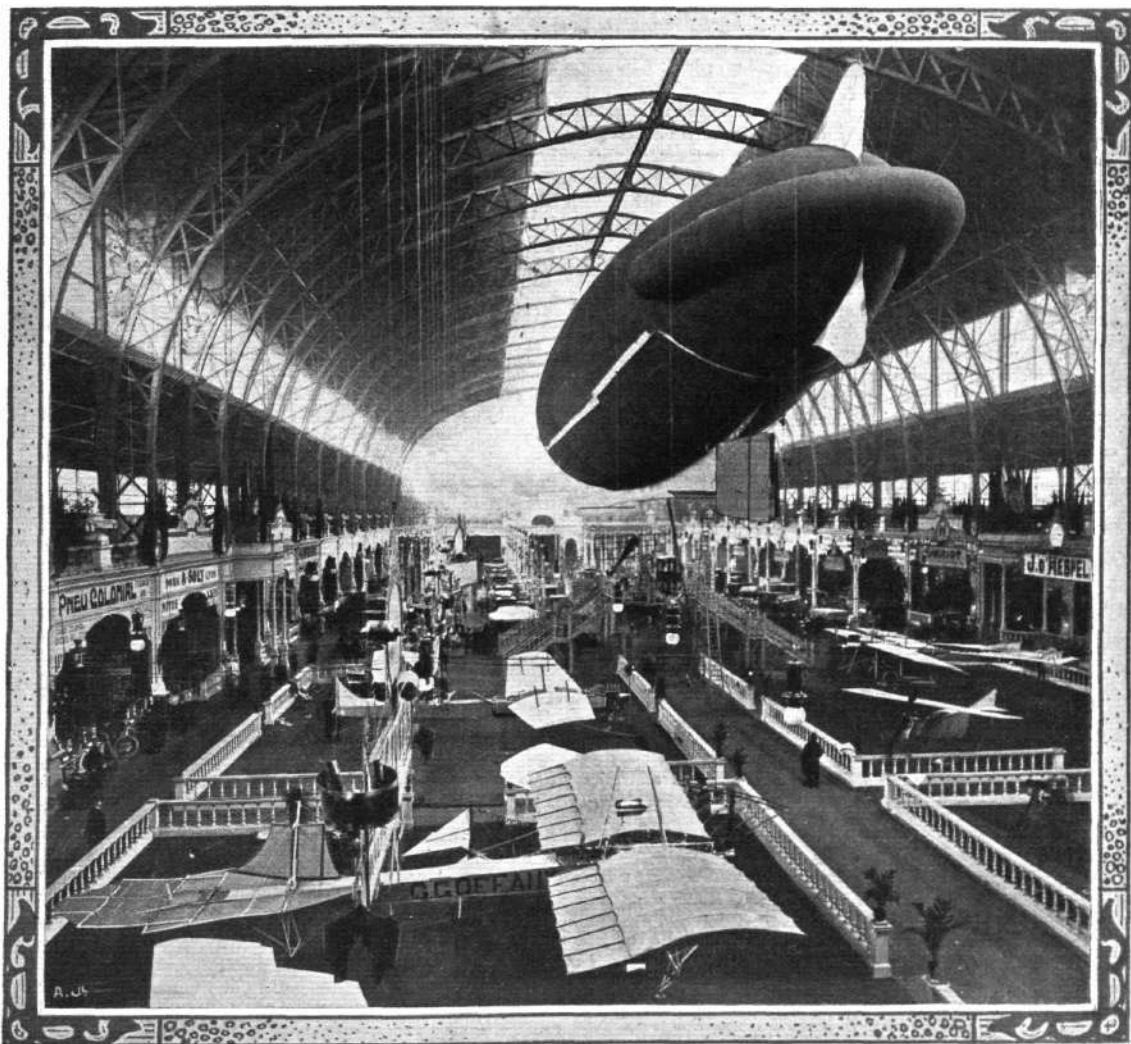

BRUSSELS AUTO AND FLIGHT EXHIBITION.—General view of the main hall taken from the aviation section of the building, the cars being seen at the further half of the hall. The dirigible suspended from the roof is the "Belgica."
