**History** Malayan Airways was formed by Straits Steamship, Ocean Steamship and Imperial Airways. The airline was renamed Malaysian Airways (MAL) in 1963, when Malaysia was formed. The Governments of Malaysia and Singapore acquired joint majority control of MAL in 1966. It was renamed Malaysia-Singapore Airlines in 1967 and then restructured into two separate airlines. Malaysian Airlines Berhad was registered on 3 April, 1971, after the ending of the Malaysia-Singapore Airlines consortium, with operations beginning in October 1972. The present name, Malaysia Airlines, was adopted in October 1987
