In 1932, all civil aviation activities were re-organised as Grazdansij Wozdusnyi Flot, simply known as Aeroflot. The Russian Federal Government reorganised Aeroflot - Soviet Airlines in July 1992, renaming the airline Aeroflot - Russian International Airlines. In April 1993 the airline became a joint stock company.
