**History** Established as the national flag carrier of the newly established state of Israel, and officially began operations with a service from Tel Aviv to Rome and Paris, extended a year later to London. Non-stop Tel Aviv-New York services were introduced on 15 June, 1961, when its Boeing 707 set the world record for the longest non-stop commercial flight covering 5,760 statute miles (9,270km) in 9h 33min. In 1991, an EI Al Boeing 747 airlifted 1,087 Ethiopian Jews out of Addis Ababa to Israel as part of Operation Solomon. In February 1995, EI Al left the technical receivership it had been operating under since 1982. Privatisation plans have been postponed several times, but are expected to be implemented during 2000.
