**History** During the Indonesian struggle for independence, a Douglas DC-3 Dakota named Seulawah landed in Rangoon as part of a commercial mission. This marked the establishment of Indonesian Airways and was the first Indonesian commercial airline overseas operation. Garuda Indonesia was formally incorporated jointly with KLM on 31 March 1950. After concentrating on domestic and regional services, the first European flights were added on 28 September 1963 to Amsterdam and Frankfurt. In July 1995 Garuda Indonesia began a joint cargo service with KLM between Amsterdam and Jakarta with intermediate stops in Bombay and Kuala Lumpur.
