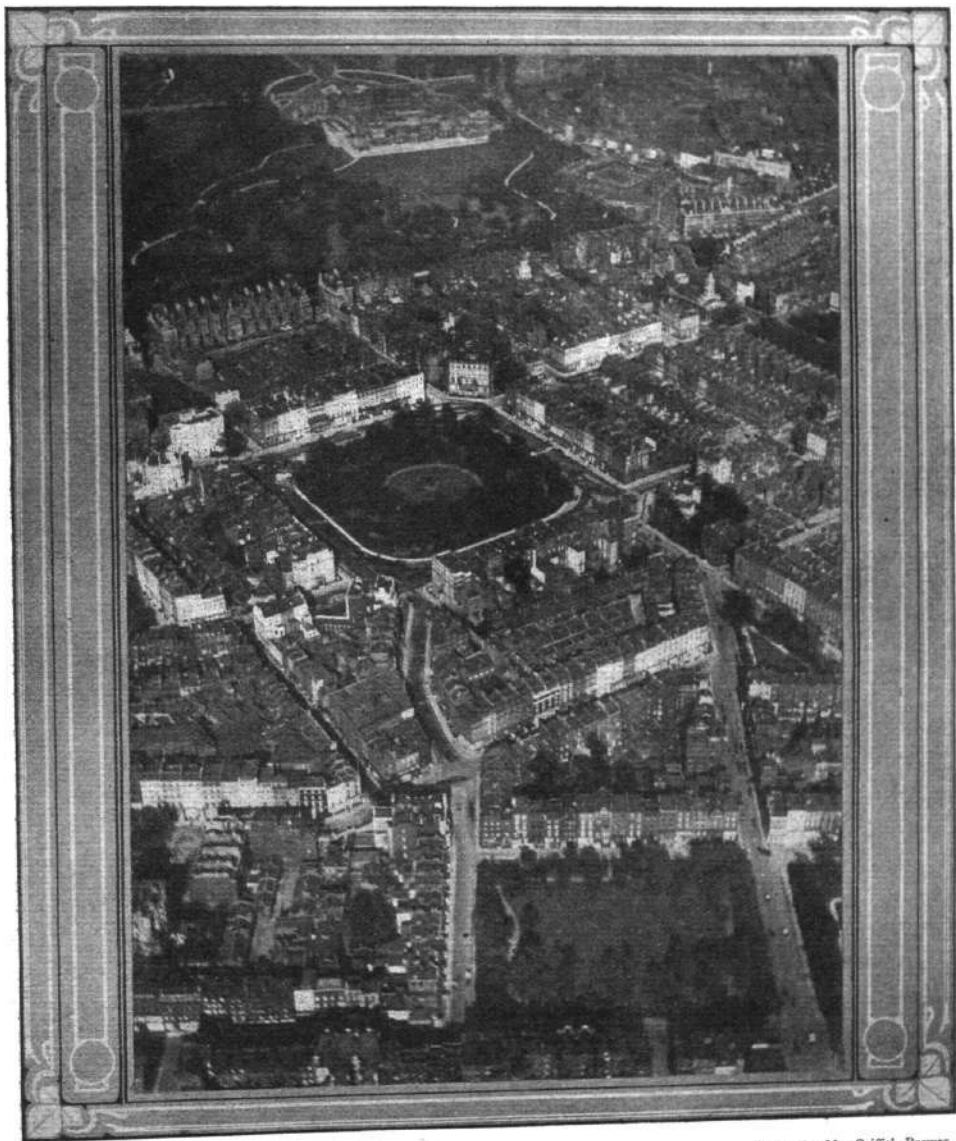

The square in the centre of the above picture is Belgrave Square, and Buckingham Palace can be seen in the far distance.
