Description National airline serving close to 155 destinations in more than 70 countries. With airline partners this extends to 300 destinations worldwide.

History Established from the merger of two pioneering Swiss airlines, Ad Astra and Balair. The Second World War forced a suspension of operations, until resumption on 30 July, 1945. Designated the national airline in 1947, and inaugurated its first transatlantic service, to New York, on 29 April, 1949. A co-operation agreement was signed with SAS in 1958, later to include KLM and UTA in the KSSU consortium. Computerised global distribution system Galileo was launched by Swissair, British Airways, KLM and United Airlines. Equity acquisitions in Crossair and Austrian Airlines (1988) and an equity swap with Singapore Airlines and Delta Air Lines culminated by the acquisition of a 49.5% stake in Sabena. Since then, further investments have been made in South African Airways and LOT Polish Airlines, as well as several European charter companies, which form the European Leisure Group.
