In February 1990 the airline became sole carrier in the intra-Ontario market place when Air Canada discontinued services in this region. On 4 April, 1990, the inaugural flight took place from Toronto City Centre airport to Ottawa and Montreal under Air Canada's Rapidair product specifications, and the airline later became an Air Canada Connector carrier until the integration of operations with AirBC and Air Nova under the Air Canada Regional banner on 1 January, 2001.
